## Resolution No. 17-18-08 Approving Draft Trustee Area Maps for Discussion at Public Hearings; Establishing the Dates, Times, and Locations of the Public Hearings; and Identifying Additional <u>Future Action to be Considered by the Board</u>

A Resolution by the Board of Education of the Covina-Valley Unified School District ("Board") Approving Draft Trustee Area Maps for Discussion at Public Hearings; Establishing the Dates, Times and Locations of the Public Hearings; and Identifying Additional Future Action to be Considered by the Board.

## RECITALS

*WHEREAS*, the Board has by Resolution No. 16-17-31 changed its policy on elections to express its intent to change to the "by-trustee area" election methodology pursuant to Education Code section 5030(b), in which each trustee must reside within a designated trustee area and is elected only by the voters in that trustee area in time for the next Governing Board election; and

*WHEREAS*, at the June 19, 2017 Board meeting, three draft trustee area maps, including potential sequence of elections identified as Green, Orange and Purple were presented by National Demographics Corporation, and the Board requested revisions to the draft trustee area maps; and

*WHEREAS*, at the August 21, 2017 Board meeting, National Demographics Corporation presented additional draft trustee area maps and potential sequence of elections identified as Green II, Orange II, and Purple II to the Board; and

*WHEREAS*, at its meeting of August 21, 2017, the Board selected draft trustee area maps Green I and Green II for presentation to the public during three community meetings to be held in September 2017 in order to receive public input and address any questions or concerns the public may have with respect to changing the District's election methodology; and

*WHEREAS*, at the September 18, 2017 Board meeting, National Demographics Corporation reported to the Board public input received during the community meetings held on September 6, 12 and 13, 2017, with respect to the draft maps and potential sequence of elections.

*NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED* that the Board hereby finds the foregoing recitals to be true and correct; and

*BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED* that the Board directs that draft maps Green and Green II and the potential sequence of elections (Exhibit A) be presented at two public hearings for comment and discussion by the community as required by Elections Code section 10010(a)(2); and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that based on its consideration of input received at the September 6, 12, and 13, 2017 community meetings and in order to give the community additional options for consideration, the Board directs that draft trustee area maps \_\_\_\_\_\_ and the potential sequence of

elections, also be presented for comment and discussion by the community during the two public hearings required by Elections Code section 10010(a)(2);

*BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED* that the two public hearings for the purpose of inviting community input on the draft maps and sequence of elections be held as follows: on October 16, 2017 at 6:30 p.m. at the District Field Building, located at 220 West Puente Street, Covina, CA 91723, and on November 6, 2017, at 6:30 p.m. at the District Field Building located at 220 West Puente Street, Covina, CA 91723; and

*BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED* that the Superintendent or designee is directed to disseminate to the public information as to the time, place and purpose of the public hearings at which the community is invited to provide its input with respect to the draft maps and sequence of the elections; and

*BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED* that if the draft map(s) and sequence of elections are revised at or following a public hearing, the draft map(s) shall be published and made available to the public for at least seven days before being adopted as required by Elections Code section 10010(a)(2); and

*BE IT FURTHER AND FINALLY RESOLVED* that following the second public hearing the Board will, in a separate public hearing, consider adoption of a final trustee area map and sequence of elections for submission to the Los Angeles County Committee on School District Organization on such date as the Board may deem appropriate.




