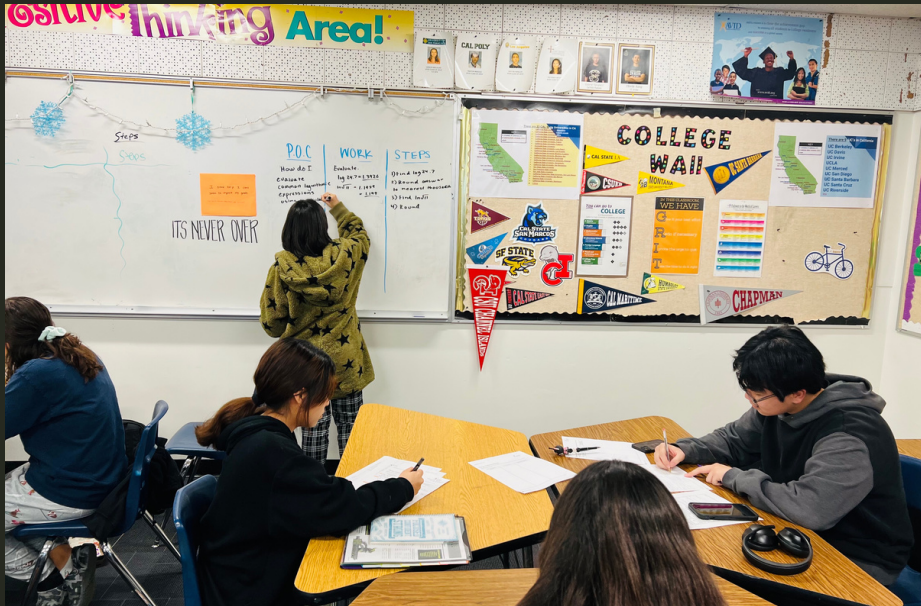

Our AVID students have tutorials twice a week. During this process our students collaborate effectively. Students present a "point of confusion"; which is typically a question they are struggling with in a core academic subject. The group members then help the student figure out the point of confusion. The students take 3-column notes in which they write down the work and the steps it took to figure out the problem. This collaborative strategy teaches students how to advocate for themselves, how to communicate and collaborate effectively, and it teaches them how to problem solve.



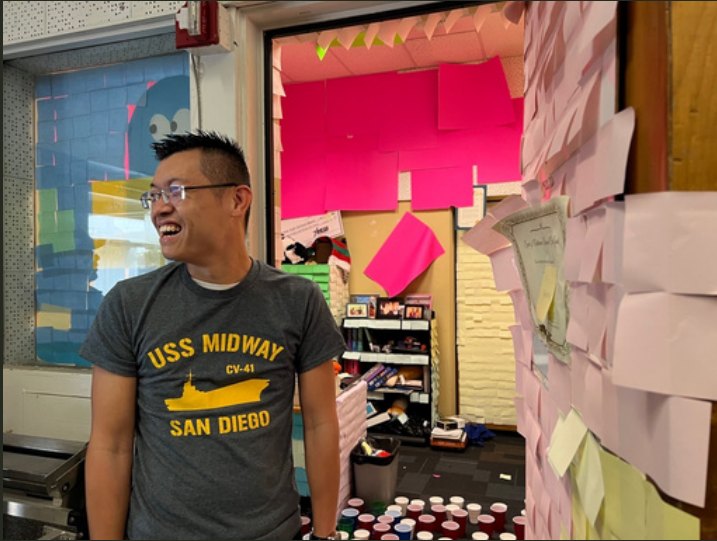

A Message from the Principal

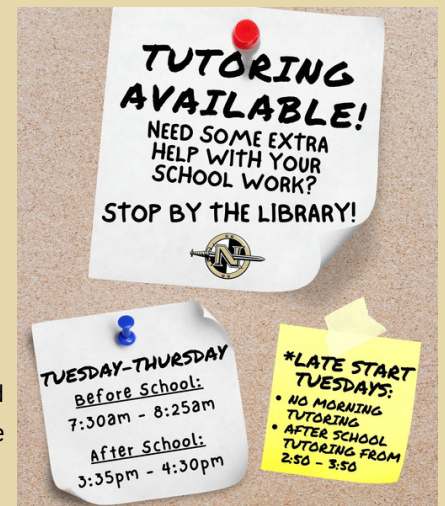

This past Saturday, Northview High School hosted the San Gabriel Valley Law Enforcement Explorer Academy graduation. Twelve students from across the San Gabriel Valley completed the program, which is led by our very own Mr. Gregg Peterson. The Explorer Academy is a 13-week program in partnership with the Covina Police Department to further immerse students in law enforcement. The program is run like a police academy, with students learning radio codes, lessons in accountability and teamwork, and physical fitness. The goal of the Academy is to give students a foot in the door at police agencies, allowing them to begin working in police departments immediately after graduating high school.

We are also starting our tutoring program this week. Mr. Grant leads our program Tuesday through Thursday before school (7:30am to 8:25am) and afterschool (3:35pm to 4:30pm). Our program offers academic support in all content areas.

HIGH SCHOOL STUDENT ACADEMIC SCHOLARSHIP CONTEST

The San Gabriel Valley District (SGVD) offers scholarships to graduating seniors intending to enroll in a college or university. Students planning to pursue any area of study, excluding music, may apply. Scholarships of \$500 will be awarded.

Applicant Must Meet the Following Minimum Requirements:

1. Have a 3.0 GPA.
2. Be a legal resident of the San Gabriel Valley District.
3. Be a graduating high school senior entering college or university in the fall.
4. Be an active participant in one or more organizations in the community.
5. **Proof of legal presence in the U.S.**

Application Process:

1. Only two (2) applicants per high school.
2. Application Packet must include the following items:
 - Academic Scholarship Application filled out completely
 - One (1) Page Essay describing:
 - School activities and other responsibilities
 - Hobbies and talents
 - Work, including types of jobs, hours and duties
 - Future goals and objectives
 - Letter of recommendation from the high school administrator, counselor, teacher and/or community leader
 - Official transcript (sealed and unopened) of student's grades, including un-weighted and weighted grade point average.

Application Due Date: The Application Packet must be submitted to the District Secretary before 5:00 p.m. on Monday, February 12, 2024.

1. Failure to complete the Application Packet properly or to include all required items in the Application Packet will eliminate the student from competition.

2. Winners and sponsoring clubs will be notified by April 1, 2024.

3. Scholarship recipients will be expected to attend the May 2024 District Meeting.

4. Proof of college enrollment must be submitted by the student to the District Secretary before October 31, 2024 or scholarship will be forfeited.

FACT SHEET FOR ALL IN FOR FREE APPLICATION FOR FEDERAL STUDENT AID (FAFSA) AND CA DREAM ACT APPLICATION (CADAA)

ALL IN FOR FAFSA/CA DREAM ACT

Starting in the 2022-23 school year, high schools and school districts (Local Educational Agencies) must ensure that 100% of students complete a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) or CA Dream Act Application (CADAA).

WHY?
All students deserve to continue their education beyond high school. Completing the FAFSA/CADAA provides access to various financial aid resources that will help reduce the cost of attendance.

WHAT IS FINANCIAL AID?
The combination of grants, scholarships, work-study opportunities, student loans, and other forms of aid to help students finance higher education.

WHEN TO APPLY
The FAFSA and CADAA for 2024-2025 will open sometime in December 2023. Students and their families are encouraged to apply as early as possible to maximize financial aid opportunities unless the student has formally submitted an opt-out waiver.

FAFSA VS CADAA
Students only need to fill out ONE of these depending on their residential status.
FAFSA: Student is a U.S. citizen, permanent resident, U.S. Visa holder, or other eligible status.
CADAA: Student is undocumented (with or without DACA), has Temporary Protected Status, or is a U.S. Visa holder.
