Our Counseling Office has been busy at work to ensure that all of our students are receiving the academic courses necessary for them to be successful and prepared for their college and career goals. Our student enrollment projection for this school year was 1,180 students. By the end of week 2, our student

in-seat attendance was 1,262. This growth in enrollment over the presummer projection marks a great opportunity for Northview. More students means that we are able to keep our existing programs at capacity to continue to best serve our student population. Our counseling team is working to process over 350 course schedule change requests. We are doing our best to meet the diverse needs of all of our students. One major change that occured in the counseling office is the departure of Ms. Secoral Yanez, who is currently the Student Services Specialist at South Hills High School. We welcome our new counselor, Mr. Ruben Casas, a Northview graduate, as our newest counselor. Welcome Mr. Casas.


Sports Updates
