Governor Newsom announces Safe Schools for All Plan and Incentive Grants

Timeline

- January 12, 2021: C-VUSD Announces Distance Learning for All Students Until Further Notice

- February 1, 2021: 1st Phase Safe Schools for All Incentive Grant Applications Due (tentative)

Important Updates

California's <u>Safe Schools for All Plan</u> provides the support and accountability to establish a clear path to minimize in -school transmissions and enable, first, a phased return to in -person instruction, and then ongoing safe in -person instruction.

- <u>COVID-19 Safety Plan</u>
 - o Conforms with California Department of Public Health (CDPH) school guidance
 - Incorporates Cal/OSHA Emergency Standards

In-Person Instruction

- TK-6 schools in counties in Purple Tier may not reopen for in -person instruction in counties with adjusted CR above 25 cases per 100,000 population per day.
- Schools may not reopen for grades 7 -12 if the county is in Purple Tier.
- Consistent with the July 17 Framework, schools may reopen at all grades if they are located in counties in the Red, Orange or Yellow Tiers under the Blueprint for a Safer Economy.

<u>School Centered COVID -19 Testing</u>

- Create a testing plan
- Partner with the state lab (Valencia Labs)
- Asymptomatic, response, and symptomatic testing



Important Updates

Los Angeles County Department of Public Health Reopening for Safer At Work and in the Community For Control of COVID -19 Updated January 29, 2021

- Permissible small cohorts: 14 students, 2 adults (not including aides assigned to students with special needs)
- Schools/District may offer child care for school -aged children so that essential member of the workforce may have child care
- All staff must wear face coverings at all times except when working alone in private offices with closed doors or when eating or drinking. The exception made previously for staff working in cubicles with solid partitions exceeding the height of the employee while standing is overridden.
- Schools/District must enact exposure management plans
- Schools/District must follow all health and safety protocols

C-VUSD to Return to 100% Distance Learning

- Effective Monday, December 14, 2020, extended until further notice on January 12, 2021
- All students return to 100% Distance Learning
 - Special Education Small Group Cohorts
 - English Learner Small Group Cohorts
 - Preschool (academic)
- Childcare Programs
 - Preschool Students through Grades 12
- All Athletic Practices and Conditioning
- Adult Education Essential Worker Classes Continue In -person
- All School Offices Closed to the Public
- Support Services Will Continue to be Offered to Students, Teachers, and Parents

C-VUSD Potential Reopening Timeline

Reopening scenarios are dependent upon decreasing COVID -19 transmission rates and the District's ability to meet all health and safety protocols.

- **Phase 1:** School offices reopen, resume athletic participation, in -person assessments, and other related services
- Phase 2: Resume small group cohorts
- Phase 3: Elementary hybrid instruction
- Phase 4: Secondary hybrid instruction (Red Tier)
- **Phase 5:** 100% return with health and safety protocols

California has contracted with Blue Shield as a third -party administrator for vaccinations

LACDPH has stated that eligible persons may receive the vaccine in their county of residence or in their county of employment.


Parent Survey

- Planning ways to improve the number of parent responses on the next survey





- No significant changes in the data since the previous update
















Permitted On -Site Programming

- Daycare for school -aged children and/or child care programs located in schools
- Specialized services for defined subgroups of children who need in -person services and Supports:
 - Students with IEPs
 - Students who are English Language learners
 - Students with needs that cannot be met through a virtual instruction platform.
 - Students present on -site may not exceed 25% of total student body at any one time
- Students may come on campus for supervised administration of college admission tests, including PSAT, ACT, and SAT exams
- Youth Sports (all activities except swim must wear a mask)
- Students may receive in -person assistance for college applications

- SBE Adopts Condensed Smarter Balanced Exams for Spring 2021.
- Condensed, temporary versions of the English Language Arts (ELA) and mathematics Smarter Balanced assessments.
- Will reduce the length of the exams by approximately half.
- The revised assessments are not expected to be released until late February 2021.
