

Role of the School Counselor

What does it mean to be College and Career Ready?

College and Career Readiness means students exit high school prepared for success in a wide range of high-quality post-secondary opportunities. Specifically, college and career readiness refers to the knowledge, skills, and dispositions needed to be successful in post-secondary education and/or training that lead to gainful employment.



College Ready

College readiness involves being prepared to enroll in and successfully complete entry-level, credit-bearing, academic programs at two- and four-year post-secondary schools as well as being equipped with the knowledge, skills, and dispositions to transition successfully. This entails having mastered rigorous content knowledge, demonstrated ability to apply knowledge through higher-order skills, and the ability to navigate the pathways that will gain access to post-secondary opportunities.





Career Ready

Career readiness involves three major areas: core academic skills and the ability to apply those skills in concrete situations in order to function in the workplace and in routine daily activities; employability skills (such as critical thinking and responsibility) that are essential in any career area; and technical, job-specific skills related to a specific career pathway. These skills allow students to enter career pathways that offer gainful employment and opportunities for advancement.





College/Career Indicator

The College/Career Indicator (CCI) is one of several state indicators that the California Department of Education reports on the California School Dashboard.

It represents the percentage of high school graduates who are prepared for college or a career. This indicator was designed to encourage high schools to provide all students with a rigorous broad course of study that prepares them for postsecondary success.





Graduates classified as <u>Prepared</u> must meet at least one of the criteria:

- Smarter Balanced Summative Assessments (CAASPP)
 - Receive a score of Level 3 "Standard Met" or higher on both English language arts/literacy (ELA) and mathematics
- Advanced Placement (AP) Exams
 - Receive a score of 3 or higher on two AP exams
- International Baccalaureate (IB) Exams
 - Receive a score of 4 or higher on two IB exams
- College Credit Courses
 - Complete two semesters of college coursework with a grade of C or better in subjects where college credits are awarded
- State Seal of Biliteracy (SSB)
 - Receive the SSB <u>and</u> a score of Level 3 or higher in ELA on the Smarter Balanced Summative Assessments (CAASPP)





- University of California (UC) and California State University (CSU) Requirements
 - Meet all a-g requirements for admission to a UC or CSU school <u>and</u> meet one of the additional criteria below:
 - Smarter Balanced Summative Assessments: Receive a score of Level 3 or higher in one subject area (ELA or mathematics) and a score of Level 2 in the other area
 - Complete one semester/two quarters/two-trimesters of College Credit Courses with a grade of C or better in academic/CTE subjects where college credits are awarded for each course
 - Receive a score of 3 on one AP exam or score 4 on one IB exam
 - Complete a CTE Pathway



What are the A-G Requirements?

The University of California (UC) and the California State University (CSU) systems have established a uniform minimum set of courses required for admission as a freshman.

Grades & GPA

Grades

- Grades are not the measure of a person, nor are they even the sole measure of academic accomplishment. They are only one reflection of how much a student has learned in their various courses.
- Schools use grades not only as reliable indicators of student content mastery, but also as leading indicators of who will be successful in college.
- Schools can also use grades to help identify students who may need additional supports during high school.
- Good grades open the door to college and university
- The grades you earn in high school are the most important factor in CSU admission decisions.



Grades & GPA

GPA

- Your grade point average (GPA) is the sum of all your course grades throughout your high school career divided by the total number of classes taken.
- At South Hills, grades are reported on a 4.0 scale.
 - A = 4 points; B = 3 points; C = 2 points; D = 1 point; F = 0 points
- All grades on the transcript are unweighted at South Hills.
- At many universities and colleges, your GPA determines your <u>eligibility for financial aid</u> <u>programs</u>, scholarships, and other support.
- Universities may choose to weight the GPA by offering extra points for Honors, AP and IB courses that a student has taken.
- CSUs and UCs will weight up to four classes (eight semesters) total and do not calculate 9th grade grades into the GPA calculation.



Understanding the CSU and UC Eligibility Reports

The district provided CSU and UC Eligibility reports for all students in grades 10-12.

These reports only contain classes that meet the a-g requirements. (No PE or Intervention classes)
