

QUALIFICATIONS FOR CHILDREN'S CENTER TEACHER INFANT-TODDLER PROGRAM

TRAINING

Required: - Any permit or credential authorizing service in instruction in a

children's center.

- Teachers in the infant toddler classes must have three semester units

relating to the care of infants and toddlers.

Preferred: - Training beyond permit requirements in early childhood education.

EXPERIENCE

Required: - That required for the permit

- Experience teaching in a children's center or other infant, toddler,

preschool or school age setting.

OTHER QUALIFICATIONS

Knowledge of: - Developmental stages, general needs and behavior or infants, toddlers,

per-school and school-age children;

Ability to: - Communicate well, both orally and in writing;

- Plan, organize and implement a challenging, developmentally

appropriate instructional program;

- Understand and attend to the physical, emotional and social needs of

young children;

- Supervise and participate in the play and physical activities of children;

- Utilize effectively a wide variety of instructional aids;

- Establish and maintain cooperative and effective working relationships

with Children's Center staff, parents, and school site personnel.

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF CHILDREN'S CENTER TEACHER INFANT - TODDLER PROGRAM

Primary Function

The teacher is responsible for the direct care, supervision and instruction of a group of infants, toddlers, preschool or school-age children at the Children's Center.

Duties and Responsibilities

The teacher:

- 1. Takes full responsibility for a group of children, planning activities that implement the approved instructional program to stimulate intellectual, emotional and physical development of each child in the group;
- 2. Establishes and maintains an environment that promotes discovery, divergent thinking and continual growth of desirable social and health habits of young children;
- 3. Works with other staff in planning curriculum for the Children's Center to meet assessed individual needs of the children in cognitive, social, emotional and physical areas of development;
- 4. Prepares weekly lesson plans and keeps appropriate anecdotal records, assessment, and conference records for all children supervised;
- 5. Provides a coordinated program integrating all required components including basic care, education, social service, nutrition and parent education;
- 6. Participates in staff development, parent education, and parent involvement activities;
- 7. Supervises children at play, directing play activities and developing materials as required;
- 8. Helps children prepare for mealtimes and serves food, drinks and snacks in a homestyle setting;
- 9. Assumes responsibility for the health and safety of children and assists them with daily care routines such as diapering, toileting, and administering first aid;
- 10. Assists the supervisor in carrying out other duties and responsibilities as directed;
- 11. Adheres to the policies of the Board of Education, the laws and regulations of the California Administrative and Education Codes and other applicable laws and regulations;
