# Permitted On-Site Programming

1. Day care for school-aged children and/or child care programs located in schools
2. Specialized services for defined subgroups of children who need in person services and Supports:
  - a. Students with IEPs
  - b. Students who are English Language learners
  - c. Students with needs that cannot be met through a virtual instruction platform.
  - d. Students present on-site may not exceed 10% of total student body at any one time
3. Children in grades TK-2 by schools that have received a Department of Public Health waiver for in-person education\*
4. Students may come on campus for supervised administration of college admission tests, including PSAT, ACT, and SAT exams
5. Youth Sports

# ELPAC Testing

- The English Language Proficiency Assessments for California (ELPAC) is the mandated state test for determining English language proficiency (ELP)
- Senate Bill 820 allows for a 45-day extension to the Initial ELPAC 30-calendar-day requirement
- Local educational agencies have a total of 75 calendar days to administer the 2020–21 Initial ELPAC, officially score it, and provide the results to parents and guardians

# TK-2 Waiver Process

## Requirements

- The District must meet and adhere to all of the protocols and requirements set forth by Los Angeles County of Public Schools for Small Group Cohort return
- Letter from district superintendent requesting this waiver
- Letters of support from the following groups:
  - All labor unions representing employees at the school reopening for classroom instruction **(REQUIRED)**. If school employees are not represented by a union, a letter from other organizations representing teachers/staff OR a letter signed by majority of teachers/staff must be submitted
  - Parent organization(s) at the school reopening for classroom instruction **(REQUIRED)**
    - The California State PTA has advised local PTA chapters against providing letters of support
- Community organization(s) that provide services for students and their families who attend the school reopening for classroom instruction. **(RECOMMENDED)**

# TK-2 Waiver Process

## Limitations

The waiver program is subject to the following limitations:

- No more than 30 schools will be granted approvals each week
- Prioritization for all slots will be given to schools with higher percentages of students qualifying for Free or Reduced-Price Meals (FRPM)
- The 30 schools per week will be equally distributed between the five Supervisorial Districts
- Letters of support from groups representing teachers and other school staff, and parents are **REQUIRED**

To date in Los Angeles County, no school or district has been granted a TK-2 Waiver

<b>MINIMAL</b> Most indoor business operations are open with modifications	<b>Less than 1</b> Daily new cases (per 100K)	<b>Less than 2% and Less than 2.2% health equity metric</b> Positive tests

# Screening and Contact Tracing

C-VUSD COVID-19 Pre-Screen & Routing is designed to help staff and students perform a pre-screen of COVID-19 symptoms prior to reporting to work or school

- Daily intake survey that helps to pre-screen students and staff based on their own symptoms and circumstances
- Instant and automatic feedback that informs staff and students if they should attend work or school
- Automatic routing of daily survey information to the appropriate staff member -- administrator, teacher, office staff
- Reporting dashboards that provide real-time information on trends and notifications
- Simple and effective contact tracing and coordination with local health officials






Distance Learning Satisfaction 3,679 Responses




Comfort Level for Return to Hybrid




Timeline for Return 3,544 Responses





Grade Level - Elementary 186 Responses





Comfort Level for Return to In-Person 424 Responses





## Grades 6-8






# Students - Satisfaction with Distance Learning






# Students - Comfort Level

## Grades 6-8




