# Timeline

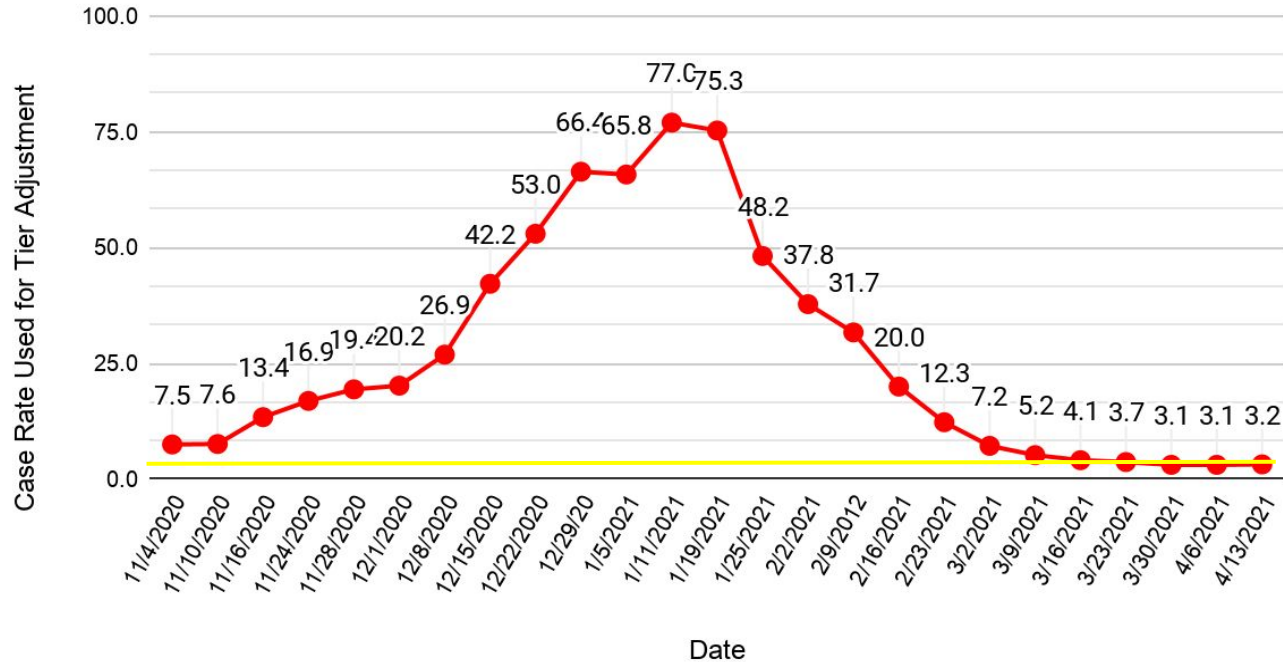
- **March 16, 2020:** All Schools Closed
  - District Administration, Nutrition Services, and MOFT Remain Working Onsite
- **May 2020:** Site Administrators and Classified Staff Return with the Exception of Instructional Aides
- **June 2020:** Kids Korner Child Care Open In-Person
- **August 2020:** High School Students and Coaches Return to Campus for Athletic Conditioning
- **August 2020:** Majority of Instructional Aides Return to Work On Site
- **September 2020:** Small Group Cohorts and TK-2 on a Waiver May Return
- **September 2020:** Tech Pods Opened
- **October 2020:** Juniors and Seniors Take PSAT/SAT; Sports Participation Increases
- **December 1, 2020:** Small Group Cohorts Begin
- **December 14, 2020:** Return to Distance Learning for All Students
- **February 3, 2021:** Phase 1 Reopening of Athletic Conditioning and In-person Assessments and Services That Cannot Be Done Virtually Resume
- **February 16, 2021:** Phase 2 Reopening of School Offices, Technology Pods, Child Care, and Fee-based Preschool
- **March 1, 2021:** Phase 3 and Phase 4 Reopening of Early Childhood Education and Special Education Preschool, and Secondary Small Group Cohorts
- **March 13, 2021:** Los Angeles County Enters the Red Tier
- **March 22, 2021:** Phase 5a Elementary Hybrid Instruction Grades TK-K Begins
- **March 29, 2021:** Phase 5b Elementary Hybrid Instruction Grades 1-2 Begins
- **April 12, 2021:** Phase 5c and Phase 6 Hybrid Instruction Grades 3-5 and Grades 6-12 Begins

# C-VUSD Phased Reopening Plan

- **Phase 1 (February 3):** Resume athletic participation, in-person assessments, and other related services
- **Phase 2 (February 16):** School offices reopen, resume technology pods, childcare, and fee-based preschool
- **Phase 3: (March 1)** Resume early childhood education and special education preschool
- **Phase 4: (March 1)** Resume small group cohorts - Secondary
- **Phase 5a: (March 22)** Elementary hybrid instruction (TK-K)
- **Phase 5b: (March 29)** Elementary hybrid instruction (Grades 1-2)
- **Phase 5c: (April 12)** Elementary hybrid instruction (Grades 3-5)
- **Phase 6: (April 12)** Secondary hybrid instruction
- **Phase 7:** 100% return with health and safety protocols

# Understanding the Data - CADPH/LA Public Health

## Los Angeles County Metrics

- **3.9% New COVID-19 Cases Per 100K**
- **3.2% Adjusted Case Rate for Tier Assignment**
- **1.5% Positivity Rate**
- **1.9% Health Equity Quartile Positivity Rate**

**Current:** Because CA has **4 million** vaccine doses administered in HPI quartile 1



The case rate, test positivity, and health equity metric thresholds must be met to move forward toward more reopening.

# Assembly Bill 86

## In-Person Instruction (IPI) Grants

- Districts must offer in-person instruction by April 1, 2021, for specified student groups.
- IPI Grants may be used for any purpose consistent with providing in-person instruction, including, but not limited to, COVID-19 testing, cleaning and disinfection, personal protective equipment, ventilation and other school-site upgrades necessary for health and safety, salaries for certificated or classified employees providing in-person instruction or services, and social and mental health support services.

## Expanded Learning Opportunities (ELO) Grants

- Districts must implement a learning recovery program, that at a minimum, provides supplemental instruction, support for social and emotional well-being, meals and snacks to specified student groups.
- ELO Grants shall be expended only for any of the following purposes: extending instructional learning time, accelerating progress to close learning gaps, integrated pupil supports, community learning hubs, supports for credit deficient pupils, additional academic services, and training for school staff.
- **C-VUSD will hold an LCAP and ELO Town Hall meeting on April 26, 2021, at 5:00 pm**

## Graduation Ceremonies

- LACDPH approves in-person graduations with 33% capacity of the District Field - Up to 4 guests per graduate (family members)
- At this capacity, C-VUSD will hold one graduation per school following the regular graduation schedule
- Guests must sit in family groups, socially distanced from other groups
- Everyone in attendance must wear a mask and follow all other health and safety guidelines

# State Testing (CAASPP/SBAC Update)

- On April 7, 2021, the US Dept. of Ed. approved CDE's waiver for spring assessment. This allows districts flexibility in the administration of alternative assessments as long as they meet the following criteria:
  - Must be aligned with CA CCSS for ELA and mathematics
  - Must be available to students in grades 3–8, and grade 11
  - Must be uniformly administered across a grade, grade span, school, or district to all eligible students
- Additionally, the assessments must meet the following reporting requirements:
  - Provide individual student results that can be reported to parents/guardians
  - Provide individual student results to educators
  - Required to publicly report for each assessment, in the School Accountability Report Card and the Local Educational Agency Report Card, the performance of students disaggregated by student group, and the number and percentage of students tested and not tested

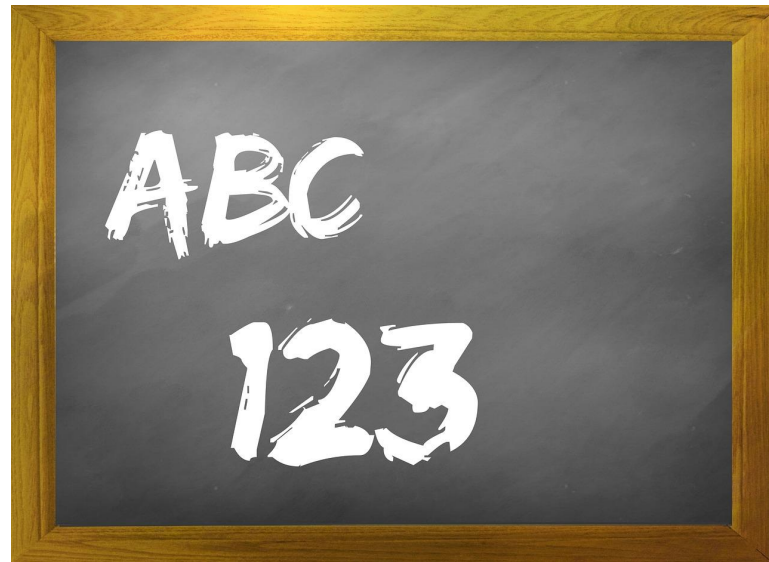
