COMPLAINT FORM

Section I: Complainant Information and Request for Response

California Education Code (EC) 35186 created a procedure for the filing of complaints concerning deficiencies related to instructional materials, conditions of facilities that are not maintained in a clean or safe manner or in good repair, and teacher vacancy or misassignment. The complaint and response are public documents as provided by statute. Complaints may be filed anonymously. However, if you wish to receive a response, you must provide the following contact information.

Complaints should be submitted to the principal of the school at which the complaint originated.

1. Textbooks and Instructional Materials



A pupil, including an English learner, does not have standards-aligned textbooks or instructional materials or state-adopted or district-adopted textbooks, or other required instructional material to use in class.



A pupil does not have access to textbooks or instructional materials to use at home or after school. This does not require two sets of textbooks or instructional materials for each pupil.



Textbooks or instructional materials are in poor or unusable condition, have missing pages, or are unreadable due to damage.

A pupil was provided photocopied sheets from only a portion of a textbook or instructional materials to address a shortage of textbooks or instructional materials.

2. Facility Conditions

A school restroom has not been maintained or cleaned regularly, is not fully operational, and has not been stocked at all times with toilet paper, soap, and paper towels, or functional hand dryers.

The school has not kept all restrooms open during school hours when pupils are not in classes, and has not kept a sufficient number of restrooms open during school hours when pupils are in classes. This does not apply when temporary closing of the restroom is necessary (1) for a documented pupil safety concern, (2) for an immediate threat to pupil safety, or (3) to repair the facility.

A condition poses a threat to the health and safety of pupils or staff while at school. These projects may include, but are not limited to, the following types of facility repairs or replacements: gas leaks, nonfunctioning heating, ventilation, fire sprinklers, or air conditioning systems, electrical power failure, major sewer line stoppage, major pest or vermin infestation, broken windows, or exterior doors or gates that will not lock and that pose a security risk, abatement of hazardous materials previously undiscovered that pose an immediate threat to pupils or staff, structural damage creating a hazardous or uninhabitable condition, and any other emergency conditions the school district determines appropriate.

3. Teacher Vacancy or Misassignment

A semester begins and a teacher vacancy exists. (A teacher vacancy is a position to which a single designated certificated employee has not been assigned at the beginning of the year for an entire year or, if the position is for a one-semester course, a position to which a single designated certificated employee has not been assigned at the beginning of a semester for an entire semester.)

A teacher who lacks credentials or training to teach English learners is assigned to teach a class with one or more English learner pupils in the class (Teacher Misassignment). This subparagraph does not relieve a school district from complying with state or federal law regarding teachers of English learners.

A teacher is assigned to teach a class for which the teacher lacks subject matter competency (Teacher Misassignment).
